OCCUPATIONAL DATA *(what sort of job market awaits a Cosmetologist or Esthetician?)*

- According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the number of personal appearance jobs is projected to jump 31 percent between 2008 and 2018. This rate of growth is nearly three times that of total U.S. employment (11 percent) during the same period.
- All of the major personal appearance occupations are projected to post job growth stronger than the overall economy between 2008 and 2018. The number of skin care specialist jobs is projected to jump 51 percent, while hairdresser, hairstylist and cosmetologist positions are expected to increase by 31 percent.
- Careers in the salon and spa industry present opportunities for business ownership. In fact, 61 percent of salons are owned by women, compared to just 30 percent of all businesses in the overall private sector.

COMPLETION RATES *(Are students completing your programs?)*

- We are required to calculate a variety of different completion rate statistics by the Department of Education and our accrediting agency, NACCAS. The one offered below is prescribed by the Department of Education.

- **On-Time Completion** – This number reflects only the students that complete their chosen program on, or before, their original contract end date. Leaves of Absence count against a student when calculating On-Time Completion. Our On-Time Completion percentage for students that completed between July 1, 2009 and June 30, 2010 (the 09-10 Award Year) is 65% for Cosmetology and 76% for Esthetics.

GRADUATE LICENSURE RATE *(Does your program prepare students for licensure?)*

- Using the calculation prescribe by our accrediting agency (NACCAS), the percentage of our graduates that obtained their license (the Licensure Rate) is 100% for Cosmetology and 100% for Esthetics.

STUDENT PLACEMENT RATE *(Are your graduates obtaining job in their field of study?)*

- Using the calculation prescribe by our accrediting agency (NACCAS), the percentage of our licensed graduates that obtained employment in their field of study (the Placement Rate) is 81% for Cosmetology and 63% for Esthetics.

STUDENTS MEDIAN LOAN DEBT *(How much does a typical student owe after leaving school?)*

- It is common for students to take out student loans to pay all or part of their school fees. The Median Loan Debt is a statistic intended to give you an idea of the amount of loan debt incurred by a student at our school. It is the amount of loan debt such that half of the graduates have less loan debt and half have more. The Median Federal Loan Debt for our graduates between July 1, 2009 and June 30, 2010 (the 09-10 Award Year) is: \$6,381 for Cosmetology and \$6,333 for Esthetics. For students using only Private Loans, the Median Loan Debt is: \$15,475 for Cosmetology and \$9,800 for Esthetics. For students using only Institutional Loans, the Median Loan Debt is: \$0 for Cosmetology and \$0 for Esthetics.

Timely Warnings

In the event that a situation arises, that, in the judgment of the School Administration, constitutes an ongoing or continuing threat, a campus wide “timely warning” will be issued. The warning will be issued verbally and/or in writing during theory class.

Depending on the particular circumstances of the crime, especially in all situations that could pose an immediate threat to the community and individuals, the School Administration may provide those present with more immediate notification. Anyone with information warranting a timely warning should report the circumstances to the School Administration, by phone (480 857-1138) or in person to a School administrator.

Policy For Reporting The Annual Disclosure of Crime Statistics

The School Administration prepares this report to comply with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Crime Statistics Act. The full text of this report is available from any member of the School administrative staff. This report is prepared in cooperation with the local law enforcement agencies surrounding our campus.

Campus crime, arrest and referral statistics include those reported to School Administration and local law enforcement agencies.

Each year, a notification is made to all enrolled students and employees that indicates how to obtain a copy of this report. Faculty and staff receive similar notification. All prospective employees may obtain a copy from a School administrator or by calling (480) 857-1138.

Crime Reporting

To report a crime:

Contact School Administrators in person or at (480) 857-1138 (non-emergencies), dial 9-1-1- (emergencies only). Any suspicious activity or person seen in the parking lots or loitering around vehicles or inside the building should be reported to the Chandler Police department. In addition you may report a crime to the following School Administrators:

The School Administration encourages anyone who is the victim or witness to any crime to promptly report the incident to the police. Because police reports are public records under state law, the School Administration cannot hold reports of crime in confidence.

All reports will be investigated. Violations of the law will be referred to law enforcement agencies and when appropriate, to the School Disciplinary Committee for review. When a potentially dangerous threat to the School community arises, timely reports or warnings will be issued as described above.

Confidential Reporting Procedures

If you are the victim of a crime and do not want to pursue action within the School or the criminal justice system, you may still want to consider making a confidential report. With your permission, the Chandler Police Department can file a report on the details of the incident without revealing your identity. The purpose of a confidential report is to comply with your wish to keep the matter confidential, while taking steps to ensure the future safety of yourself and others. With such information, the School can keep an accurate record of the number of incidents involving students, determine where there is a pattern of crime with regard to a particular location, method, or assailant, and alert the campus community to potential danger. Reports filed in this manner are counted and disclosed in the annual crimes statistics for the school.

Access Policy

During business hours, the School will be open to students, parents, employees, contractors, guests, and invitees. During non business hours access to all School facilities is by key, if issued, or by admittance via School Administration. In the case of periods of extended closure, the School will admit only those with prior written approval.

Security Awareness and Crime Prevention Programs

During orientation personal safety, crime prevention and facility security are outlined. Students are told about crime on-campus and in surrounding areas. Similar information is presented to new employees.

A common theme of all awareness and crime prevention programs is to encourage students and employees to be aware of their responsibility for their own security and the security of others.

In addition to seminars, information is disseminated to students and employees through crime prevention awareness packets as appropriate.

When time is of the essence, information is released to the School community through security alerts as indicated above.

***Tip:** To enhance personal safety, and especially after an evening class, walk with friends or someone from class that you know well, or call the Eagle Patrol Services for an escort.*

Substance Abuse Policy

The Studio Academy of Beauty complies with the federal Drug Free Schools and Campuses Act (DFSCA) which prohibits the unlawful possession, use, or distribution of alcohol and illicit drugs by students and employees on the school premises or in conjunction with any off-campus school-sponsored activity. In accordance with federal regulations, The Studio Academy of Beauty's policy is included in the Student Handbook, which is made available to every student upon registration. Information on the drug and alcohol policy is included with the annual Campus Crime and Security Report, which is distributed to every student and employee. The school conducts a periodic review of this policy to determine the effectiveness of this policy and to ensure that disciplinary sanctions for violating standards of conduct are enforced consistently.

Standards of Conduct

- No student or employee shall manufacture, distribute, use or possess alcohol, a controlled substance or drug paraphernalia while on the school premises or in conjunction with any off-campus school-sponsored activity.
- A student or employee may possess a controlled substance for their sole use while on the school premises or in conjunction with any off-campus school-sponsored activity if, and only if, it is authorized by law. Under no circumstance is a student or employee permitted to manufacture or distribute a controlled substance.
- No student shall report to campus, and no employee shall report to work while under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance, except as prescribed by a physician, which affects alertness, coordination, reaction, response, judgment, decision making, or safety.

School Disciplinary Actions

Students or employees who violate this policy will be subject to disciplinary actions up to and including termination. The severity of the actions will be determined by the severity and frequency of the violation(s) as judged by and in the sole discretion of the school administration.

Legal Sanctions

Federal and state sanctions for illegal possession of controlled substances may be imposed by local, state and federal authorities as a result of violation(s) of this policy.

Education and Treatment Programs

The Studio Academy of Beauty provides periodic information for employees and students to foster a drug and alcohol free environment. Counseling is available to help students deal with personal concerns the might interfere with their academic work while at the school. Services are free and confidential and can be arranged by contacting the School Director.

Sexual Assault Prevention and Response

The School educates the student community about sexual assaults and date rape through mandatory orientations. The Police Department offers sexual assault education and information programs to students and employees upon request.

If you are a victim of a sexual assault at this institution, your first priority should be to get to a place of safety. You should then obtain necessary medical treatment. The School Administration strongly advocates that a victim of sexual assault report the incident in a timely manner. Time is a critical factor for evidence collection and preservation. An assault on School grounds should be reported directly to a School official. Additionally, filing a Police report is vital to:

- ensure that a victim of sexual assault receives the necessary medical treatment and tests, at no expense to the victim
- provide the opportunity for collection of evidence helpful in prosecution, which cannot be obtained later (ideally a victim of sexual assault should not wash, douche, use the toilet, or change clothing prior to a medical/legal exam)
- assure the victim has access to free confidential counseling from counselors specifically trained in the area of sexual assault crisis intervention.

When a sexual assault victim contacts the Police Department, the Sex Crimes Unit will be notified as well. The victim of a sexual assault may choose for the investigation to be pursued through the criminal justice system and the School Conduct Council, or only the latter. A representative from the Police Department or the School will guide the victim through the available options and support the victim in his or her decision.

Sex Offender Registration

In accordance to the "Campus Sex Crimes Prevention Act" of 2000, which amends the Jacob Wetterling Crimes Against Children and Sexually Violent Offender Registration Act, the Jeanne Clery Act and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, the School is providing a link to the AZ Sex Offender Information website. This act requires institutions of higher education to issue a statement advising the campus community where law enforcement information provided by a State concerning registered sex offenders may be obtained. It also requires sex offenders already required to register in a State to provide notice of each institution of higher education in that State at which the person is employed, carries a vocation, or is a student.
